
HANDWRITING COMPETITION

"CULTIVATION OF MIND SHOULD BE THE ULTIMATE AIM OF HUMAN EXISTENCE."

On the occasion of Ambedkar Jayanthi, a special assembly was held at Akshara Vaagdevi International school where students from grade V to X participated. The event was held on April 13th, which marks the 129th birth anniversary of B.R. Ambedkar, who is also known as Babasaheb Ambedkar. He was a renowned Indian jurist, economist, politician, and social reformer who fought against social discrimination towards the Dalits and played a pivotal role in the formation of the Dalit Buddhist movement. He was also the first Minister for Law and Justice in independent India and the chief architect of the Constitution of India.

During the assembly, Ved, a student in grade VII, spoke about the significance of the Indian Constitution. He explained how it provides basic rights to all citizens, and how the government is elected, and who has the power and responsibility to make important decisions. Ruchitha, a student in grade IX, spoke about the personal life of Ambedkar, while Subham Varma and Saketh Ram shared Ambedkar's achievements. They mentioned that Ambedkar had established the Bahishkrit Hitakarini Sabha to promote education and socio-economic improvements among Dalits. Ambedkar also launched magazines like Mooknayak, Equality Janta and Bahishkrit Bharat. In 1927, he started an active agitation against untouchability. The students also made flashcards of Ambedkar and the Indian Constitution. Saketh Ram, a student in grade VIII, dressed up as Ambedkar. Finally, all the students took the preamble pledge of the Indian Constitution to show their commitment to the values and principles enshrined in it.
