The guest for the day was Dr.MV Reddy retired IAS. He is also a doctor who joined the service when he was a collector.

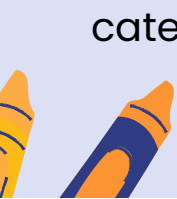

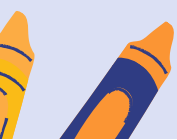

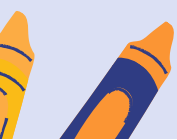
